Ride within your own capabilities, operate at safe and appropriate speeds, and never consume alcohol or drugs before or while driving.

We also want to remind snowmobilers to be good sports – we all play an important part in making sure the sport continues to be a safe and enjoyable one, and setting a positive example and using common sense, can help the sport grow in the best way possible:

Leave Tracks, Not Trash - If you had space to bring it in, then respect nature by carrying it out too

Protect Wildlife – Animals are more vulnerable in winter, so keep your distance and leave them alone.

- Ensure your snowmobile is working properly.
- Avoid riding along power lines and watch for guy wires.
- Steer clear of high snow banks around overhanging power lines.
- Proceed slowly near utility workers, vehicles or equipment.
- Stay off the ice, including reservoirs and rivers near hydroelectric dams where ice is unstable.





Report Trail Hazards

Drastic changes in weather are getting more common every year in Newfoundland. If you spot a hazard, please report it to your local club and/or contact the NLSF via telephone or email info@nlsf.org.

Be as specific as possible and attach photos if you have them, so the correct equipment can be brought in to address the problem. If you're able, mark it with tape or whatever you may have on hand.

A hazard may include:

- Washout on the trail
- Tree down across the trail
- Damaged or unsafe bridge
- Vandalism to warm up shelters or trail signage
- Obstacles such as large rocks or stumps

Avalanche safety in Newfoundland

Avalanche safety is a growing concern in Newfoundland and Labrador as an increasing number of snowmobilers venture off the trails and into the mountains. Newfoundland's biggest avalanche terrain is found along the West Coast in the Long Range Mountains which includes some of the more popular riding regions – Gros Morne National Park, North Arm Hills, Blomidon Mountains, and Lewis Hills.

Avalanche Canada is again issuing avalanche forecasts for the Long Range Mountains every Friday and Saturday until April 8. An avalanche forecast provides valuable information about avalanche danger for a given mountainous area over a certain time. They feature danger ratings, avalanche problems, and details on snowpack, avalanche observations, and weather. You can find these forecasts on the Avalanche Canada website http://ow.ly/59fg50MTpEA or on their app.

You can also help out your fellow riders by posting observations of your trip to the Mountain Information Network (MIN) https://avalanche.ca/mountain-information-network/submissions to let them know about snow conditions and recent avalanche activity.






It's the little things that make a big difference
