ANOTHER SNOWMO-**BILE SEASON HAS COME** AND GONE: The climb in temperatures signaled the end of the 2022/23 season with grooming ceased across the island as of April 17. For much of the island it was a typical Newfoundland winter with the ups and downs of Mother Nature however, volunteers and groomer operators put in countless hours and long days in making sure we had great trails to ride on.

Changes to family rebate system for the 2023/24 season

The family rebate is designed to allow families who have multiple snowmobiles registered at the same civic address a \$12.00 discount for their second and third machines. Beginning next season there will no longer be a limit on the number of additional machines that can avail of the discount, as long as they are all registered at the same civic address. 1st machine will remain at full price, no discount given.

Families can apply for the rebate by completing the rebate form (available online or at the NLSF office), providing copies of your snowmobile registrations (indicating a common address) and a copy of your trail pass application form (if purchased at a vendor). - Steer clear of high snow banks around overhanging power lines.
- Proceed slowly near utility workers, vehicles or equipment.
- Stay off the ice, including reservoirs and rivers near hydroelectric dams where ice is unstable.




