


### From Fall Preparations to Winter Rides: How Your Trail Pass Makes It All Possible

#### **Trail Upgrades in Action**

Our clubs have been busy getting the trail network ready for the season, and there's been plenty of progress across the province. Crews have been clearing brush, repairing bridges, upgrading signage and tackling grading and excavator work to keep routes safe and smooth for winter riders.

This year, the NLSF contributed nearly \$165,000 to clubs to support trail maintenance and upgrades, funding that's already making a visible impact on the ground.

Warm-up shelters are also shaping up for the colder months with fresh repairs, new features and well-stocked wood. Several cookhouses and woodsheds have been built or refreshed, adding extra comfort for riders taking a break along the way. "A lot of hard work has gone into these trails, and it shows," says Matthew Swain, NLSF General Manager. "We're gearing up for a solid season."

It's been a productive off-season behind the scenes, with volunteers putting in steady effort to ensure the system is ready when the snow hits.



## Discovery Trail Snowmobile Association Wins National Environmental Award

The Discovery Trail Snowmobile Association (DTSA) was recently awarded the CCSO National Environmental Award, recognizing their impressive commitment to sustainability and environmental stewardship.

DTSA set out to build a new equipment facility that would not only support their operations, but also reflect their responsibility to the land they ride on. From the early planning stages, the executive made environmental impact a top priority, designing a building that is durable, functional and built for long-term sustainability.

A major part of the project is their goal to achieve a net-zero energy facility. The building is designed with optimal roof orientation for solar production and features approximately 50 solar panels, generating power from March to November and feeding excess energy back into the grid. This offsets winter consumption when daylight is limited, helping manage rising costs while reducing the club's carbon footprint. The system is expected to prevent over 8 tonnes of CO<sub>2</sub> emissions annually, equal to planting more than 400 trees every year.

And they didn't stop there. The club also took direct action on the ground by re-planting trees in the area, helping restore cutovers and support healthy forest growth along their trail network.

It's not just about riding, it's about protecting the places we ride. Congratulations to Discovery Trail Snowmobile Association for their leadership, innovation and well-deserved national recognition.

This information helps us understand rider activity across the island and plays a key role in determining funding and planning future upgrades.




### Garmin Tread October Giveaway

During the month of October, everyone who purchased their NLSF trail pass was automatically entered to win a Garmin Tread GPS.




A look at the trail networks maintained by NLSF clubs across the island


